FOR OTHERS


The River Wey flows through our harbour to Weymouth Beach. By protecting the harbour's water quality, we're ensuring a safe, clean beach for all to enjoy.

Calling all boat users...

All hands on deck to keep our harbour clean



DON'T THROW ANYTHING OVERBOARD

Keep a bag for rubbish and recycling on your boat, then use the waste facilities on shore.

There are multiple rubbish and recycling points around the harbour. See our map of Weymouth Harbour overleaf.

Anything you throw overboard can have an impact on water quality, wildlife and other boat users.


Even an orange peel can take around two years to degrade in the water, and the milky remains of a cup of coffee can lead to a build up of bacteria in the water.



USE ONSHORE TOILETS

There are toilets and shower facilities at the harbour office and at several other locations around the harbour.

There are also washrooms and waste facilities beside the marina offices on Commercial Road.



FIT A HOLDING TANK OR CHEMICAL TOILET

Hold onto your black water until you can use a pump out facility.

Discharging untreated sewage into the harbour is harmful to the environment and has an impact on all water users.

We will soon have our own pump out station installed at Weymouth harbour, so get your boat prepared in advance!

In the meantime, tanks can be emptied at Portland Marina pump out station on T pontoon. Contact the marina crew by telephone or on VHF 80 for assistance.
